<p><b>Swiss Government</b></p> <p><b>SIDA</b></p>	<p><b>The Swiss Government</b> actively participates in the policy dialogue on PFM reform. Even though by now it has not been financing any full-fledged project in this domain The Swiss Government together with Sida and the WB are discussing the possibility of establishing a PFM Capacity Building Trust Fund aimed at increasing skills and knowledge of technical and management staff of MoF and line ministries.</p> <p><b>Government Securities Market Development Project</b> aims to foster the conditions that promote development of government securities market and domestic debt management in Kyrgyzstan. Objectives of the Project include: (i) strengthening the management of fiscal and monetary policies through improved coordination between Ministry of Finance and Central Bank; (ii) providing technical advice on the key steps to improve the liquidity and deepness of government securities market; (iii) reviewing the necessary securities legislation in place and providing advice on the appropriate legal framework; (iv) preparing Central Bank on the opportunities and challenges of conducting monetary policy as financial markets develop.</p> <p>Likewise, <b>Sida</b> has been supporting the PFM reforms in KG through some targeted TA expertise. Despite the recent decision of the Swedish Government to phase out from CA, Sida remains committed to support the abovementioned PFM CB Trust Fund in its first years of implementation.</p>	<p><b>On-going</b></p>
